

What is a Watershed?



A watershed is an area of land where all of the water collects into the same place, like a river or lake.

The Grand River Watershed, pictured below, drains into Lake Michigan. Lake Michigan eventually drains into the Atlantic Ocean via the St. Lawrence Seaway.

Look at the map below to see the smaller watersheds that make up the Grand River Watershed. Which watershed do you live in?

Water from your watershed flows into the Grand River, which drains into Lake Michigan.

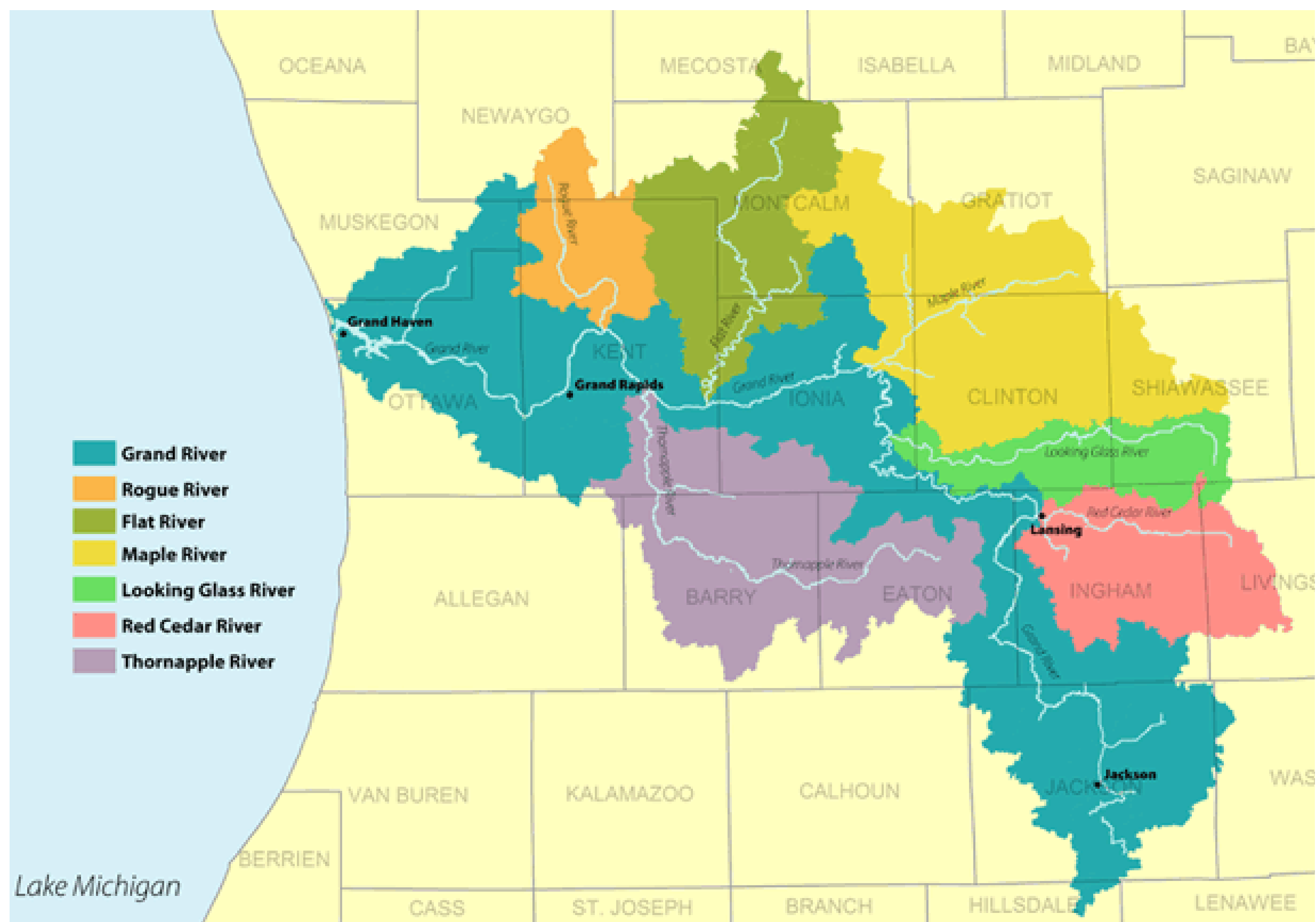
